The smell was HORRIBLE! We lost both elevators, 10 a/c units, our new walk in freezer with all the contents in it. We lost all our paper products that were stored in the new addition storage closet and all our decorations, toys and cleaning supplies. We lost our van, wheel chairs, and wagons that our burn patients use when they arrive at our House. All the doors downstairs need to be replaced as well as the controls to both garage gates. There is more but I will stop there."</p> <p>RMHC is asking for folks to do collect cleaning supplies and paper goods (especially toilet paper).
