### Services

- Texas' oldest academic medical center (since 1891), the University of Texas Medical Branch at Galveston (UTMB) is dedicated to health science education, high-quality patient care, cutting-edge research, and service to the community. Hundreds of thousands of patients from Galveston County and beyond seek care at UTMB every year.
- UTMB operates a Level 1 Trauma Center, one of only three in the greater Houston area serving patients of all ages.
- Almost 3,000 students are enrolled at our four schools, with more than 560 medical residents.
- We are home to the Galveston National Laboratory, the only national laboratory in Texas and the only one of its kind on a U.S. university campus.
- UTMB Health has more than 70 primary and specialty care clinics in nearly 40 sites throughout Galveston and Bay Area communities including:
  - The Specialty Care Center at Victory Lakes in League City offering orthopedics, obesity care, pelvic health, breast care, and other specialty care and out patient surgical services .
  - A new Multispecialty Center and Stark Diabetes Clinic in League City offering pain, geriatrics, cardiology, ophthalmology, transplant, multidiscipline diabetes care and other specialty care .
  - Other clinics focusing on pediatric specialty care, dermatology, sports medicine, oral surgery and ear, nose and throat on the mainland.
- Clinical excellence in women's and children's health, geriatrics, ENT, burns care, transplants, diabetes and metabolic disorders, neurological diseases at facilities in Galveston and on the mainland.
