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Bay Area Houston Economic Partnership (BAHEP) is a member-driven organization that provides leadership to stimulate regional economic development and employment in a range of industries such as aerospace engineering, biotechnology/bioscience, specialty chemicals and plastics, and information technology and communications. BAHEP partners with 270 member companies, 13 cities, Galveston County, Harris County and the Port of Houston Authority in southeast Texas to foster economic vitality through regional collaboration.

Commercial / Office / Industrial Development

NA Industries, based in Chattanooga, TN, and a wholly owned subsidiary of Nippon Shokubai Co. LTD, headquartered in Osaka, Japan, will build a new \$100 million plant to produce superabsorbent polymers. The product, also known as SAP, is used in diapers, surgical pads, and wound dressings. Location of the new facility will be next to American Acryl at 4923 Bayport Road (Old Hwy 146) on a 10-acre site in **Pasadena's Industrial District**. It's expected to be in operation by June 2012 and will have a production capacity of 60,000 metric tons per year. Sixty full-time jobs will be created. BAHEP worked this project with the City of Pasadena and representatives of NA Industries.

Air Liquide broke ground for its new hydrogen production facility on Fairmont Parkway in **La Porte** within the **Bayport Industrial District**. The Hydrogen Steam Methane Reformer (SMR) plant incorporates the latest technology of Air Liquide that provides efficient and environmentally responsible hydrogen production. This project will be the first installation of an SMR in the U.S. using this design. The plant will be capable of producing more than 100 million cubic feet per day of pure hydrogen for the company's Gulf Coast Pipeline System, which services industrial customers along the coast from Freeport to Port Arthur, TX. It's expected to be operational in late 2011. Investment value and employee numbers are not known at this time.

Effective Environmental Inc. based in Dallas, has purchased a 30,000 SF property on 5 acres in the **Bayport Industrial District** at 9950 Chemical Road.

Eastin Wells Inc. based in Long Beach, CA, leased 12,000 SF on 1.5 acres at 300 Hwy 146 N in **La Porte**. The company specializes in supplying high quality, chemical-free natural raw honey products to the United States, especially from Taiwan, Indonesia, Vietnam, Argentina, India and Thailand. Most of its customers are honey processors and packers that cater to major food companies in the U.S.

Cates Control Systems, a national distributor of industrial automation products, has purchased

two buildings in **Houston** near Ellington Airport at 14221 and 14251 Gulfstream Park. It's reported the company will relocate its corporate headquarters and build a distribution/service center at the new site.

H&M Mechanical Constructors Inc. purchased two buildings totaling more than 10,000 SF plus 18 acres at Center St. and Red Bluff Rd. in **Pasadena** to accommodate the company's expanding needs and future growth requirements. It provides construction services in the oil and gas, refining, chemical and petrochemical industries. Also offered is engineering and design/build services.

Wrist USA just expanded by 24,000 SF at East Belt Business Park in **Pasadena**; the company now occupies 69,000 SF. It is one of the world's leading ship supply companies offering general ship supply, catering, sea catering, bulk and marine logistics. *BAHEP member CB Richard Ellis – Faron Wiley represented the landlord.*

Houston Physicians Hospital at 333 North Texas Ave. in **Webster** has an expansion underway that will add another operating room and 11 more beds.

The Heart and Vascular Hospital at **Webster's** Clear Lake Regional Medical Center plans to add 72 private rooms on its 4th and 5th floors. This is a \$17 million expansion project with a projected completion date of February 2011. Once complete, the facility will encompass 305,000 SF.

Cole Crossing, a 19,764 SF medical and retail center, is underway at SH 3 and Cole Street in **Webster**. It should be ready for occupancy in late July.

- Want the look of Southern Italy? Cypress Bay, a 60-acre development off FM 2094 in **League City**, will see the first two waterfront homes under construction in July. Harbour Classic Homes plans a two-story, 3,400 SF home and Centurion Builders plans a 5,000 SF, three-level home, complete with a roof-top terrace and pool. Two sections are planned: 60 homes – all waterfront and 30 homes – 16 of which are waterfront. This is a gated community; 40' boats can be accommodated.

Infrastructure News and Everything Else!

BAHEP's Citizens for Space Exploration (CSE) made its 19th Annual Trip to Washington, D.C., from May 17-19, 2010. Representing 26 states, 145 CSE travelers – including 32 "Gen Y" university students met with 355 congressional offices to speak on behalf of America's leadership

in human space exploration. These meetings were in addition to 73 congressional office visits made in March this year. CSE conducts the largest (i.e. most congressional offices contacted, most participants and most states represented) pro-human space exploration grassroots annual trip to Washington, D.C. in the nation.

City News

- **Friendswood** – City council has approved a \$15,000 economic incentive grant to HomeTown Bank for the development of a 7,864 SF building. Located at 600 S. Friendswood Drive in the downtown neighborhood empowerment zone, the grant will reimburse costs related to construction and development of the project including landscaping improvements. Additionally, \$9,284 in development fees, water and wastewater impact fees will be waived. The \$1.6 million bank will occupy 4,779 SF and lease 3,085 SF.

Did you know that the median household income is \$117,000 in **Friendswood**? There are more than 20 banks for the 37,000 residents!

- **League City** – The construction of a new criminal justice facility is being considered. The building would include a police station, jail, emergency operations center and administrative offices. This project could end up as a regional public safety and emergency operations center if the city partners with Galveston County. There are issues to resolve, including funding.

Did you know that **League City** is the corporate headquarters of American Homestar Corporation? Its South Shore Harbour office houses 45 of the company's 620 total employees.

As part of the Hurricane Ike rebuilding effort in Galveston County, the company was selected as one of five contractors to rebuild homes. The modular homes will be built and then transported to home sites for installation by local contractors. There are two

Housing and Urban Development CDBG (Community Development Block Grants) grants totaling \$245 million for repairing and rebuilding housing damaged by Ike.

- **Webster** – The city plans a new 18,000 SF Central Fire Station within the next two years on property adjacent to City Hall – Pennsylvania St. at SH 3.
- **La Porte** – City Council has approved an amendment to its tax abatement package. To qualify for tax abatements, businesses must provide a minimum capital investment of \$3 million and be located within the city limits. Abatements include 10 percent property tax rebates for rail-served facilities, 10 percent for manufacturing facilities and between 10 and 50 percent rebates for retail and commercial office businesses, depending on square footage.

The city has begun its free summer concert series at its new Five Points Plaza – every Friday starting in June.

- **Clear Lake Shores** – The city will rebid the Jarboe Bayou Bridge restoration project. Also, a proposition has been approved that will allow the city to move forward on the new town center – a three to five year project.
- **Seabrook** – The city is designing a gateway to make the area more visible to tourists. One area being considered for a banner is across 10th Street at Todville Road near 'The Point'. Officials plan \$7 million in improvements for that area including raising Waterfront Drive, dropping utilities underground, some decorative lighting and maybe a boardwalk.

Galveston County -- On June 14th, the Port of Galveston and the Port of Houston Authority will hold a public meeting to present information and seek comments about a feasibility study for a container terminal at Pelican Island (reported in the *Galveston Daily News*). Displays of the

proposed project will be available for public viewing, and port representatives and study team members will be on hand to provide information and answer questions. 5:30 PM - 8:30 PM at Galveston Island Convention Center.

Education news

- San Jacinto College and CenterPoint Energy are partnering on a \$407,000 job training grant from the Texas Workforce Commission to train 1,308 workers on the smart grid. They will earn an average wage of \$26/hr. after training.
- College of the Mainland's pharmacy technician program has been accredited by the American Society of Health-System Pharmacists. The college has graduated more than 300 students since the program began in 2001.
- Capital improvement work has begun at all three San Jacinto College campuses. Thanks to a \$295 million bond referendum approved two years ago, the infrastructure phase is underway; phase two will be the construction of new buildings and facilities; phase three is renovations to existing facilities.
- Clear Creek ISD's robotics team and its alliance partners won the regional robotics tournament held in April. More than 65 teams entered the competition in Houston and this was one of 45 regional tournaments held around the world. The tournament, 'For Inspiration and Recognition of Science and Technology' (FIRST) promotes science and technology to young people everywhere.
- UTMB has outlined a plan to meet the growing need for medical professionals. By 2020, student enrollment will increase by 100 percent in both the School of Nursing and the School of Health Professions. The School of Medicine will increase its enrollment by 25 percent. The number of residency slots will also increase. UTMB President David Callender said the university is in the planning stage of state-of-the-art facilities to accommodate an expanding student body. Also, there are plans to recruit additional faculty.
- New programs at San Jacinto College--
 - Diagnostic Medical Sonography. Employment in this field is expected to increase by 18 percent through 2018. Wages in 2008 were approx \$62,000.
 - International Business and Logistics (IBUS). Jobs available to graduates include import specialists, custom brokers, freight forwarders, U.S. customs agents and logistics coordinators ... to name a few. There is high demand for maritime employees!

- A public meeting was held today to address questions and concerns about the FM 518 Bypass project – intersection of FM 518, FM 270 and FM 2094. Information about the project and meeting can be found at www.leaguecity.com.
